Dr Tess Ridge is a lecturer in Social Policy at the University of Bath. Her research interests are childhood poverty and social exclusion, children and family policy, social security policy and comparative social security, especially support for children and families. She has considerable experience researching with children and families. She has recently completed a three year ESRC Research Fellowship developing a child-centred approach to understanding how children fare within the policy process. At present she is involved (in collaboration with Professor Jane Millar), in a new longitudinal qualitative research project exploring the lives of children and lone mothers in low-income working households.
